




Safety tips

Note the following safety precautions for positioning, connecting and operating the telephone.

- *♀* Place your telephone on a non-slip mat!
- Position the connection cable carefully to avoid accidents!
- Avoid positioning the telephone near heat sources, in direct sunlight and in the vicinity of other electrical equipment.
- Protect your telephone against dust and avoid exposing it to moisture, steam or aggressive liquids.
- Plug the connection cable only into the outlet intended for this purpose.
- Connect only authorised accessories.
- - open your telephone yourself!
 - touch contacts with pointed, metallic objects!
- Clean your telephone only with a slightly damp cloth or antistatic cloth. Never use a dry cloth or cleaning and chemical substances.
- Do not use your telephone in damp rooms (e.g. bathroom) or in areas at risk from explosion.

Operating elements and displays

1 Display

Two-line alphanumeric display with 24 characters per line

2 Foxkey (multifunction key)

The available functions are shown under the display line and directly called up by pressing the Foxkey under the relevant text.

3 Menu key

Press once: Select main menu, return from sub-menus to the main menu.

Press and hold down: Switch TAM on and off for all users

4 Telephone answering device LED

Unlit: TAM switched off.

Lit: TAM switched on, no messages. Slow flash: TAM switched on, no messages.

Fast flash: TAM memory full

5 User key

Select user A, B, C, D or E

6 User LED

Unlit: All users accept calls. Lit: At least one user is not accepting calls (Call Forwarding active, Do Not Disturb etc.)

7 Dialling keypad

12 dual-function keys for numerical and alphanumerical entry

8 Short dialling keys

The five short dialling keys are capable of storing two numbers and are freely programmable

9 Emergency mode switch

The emergency mode switch is located under the write-on label.

10 ESC key (Escape key)

Press once: Skip to previous menu level. Press and hold down: Switch to standby mode

11 LOG key

Shows the numbers of the last 10 answered calls

12 Redial key

Shows the last 10 dialled numbers

13 Loudspeaker key

Switch loudspeaker on and off

14 R key (enquiry key)

Initiate enquiry call, switch between two calls

15 Park key

Park and retrieve a call

16 Minus and plus keys (cursor keys)

Move cursor left or right, adjust volume up or down, decrease or increase values



Operating Instructions

Connecting the telephone

The connection sockets are located on the underside of the telephone.



Insert the cord in the cable auide 3.

Now plug the shorter connector of the telephone cable into the socket m on the underside **4**. Make sure the connector clicks into place. Pull lightly on the cable to check that it is in position

Insert the other end of the cable into your ISDN telephone outlet 6.

Insert the cable in the cable quide 6.

To release the cable use a ballpoint pen or similar object to press the holding hook on the connector in the direction of the connector body and prise the connector out along with the cable.

Display on setup


Once you have connected your Eurit 33 / 33 plus the display shows the prompt: »Bitte geben Sie mindestens eine MSN (Mehrfachrufnummer) mit Bezeichnung ein«. (Please enter at least one MSN (Multiple Subscriber Number) with code).

To be able to use all the functions of your Eurit 33 / 33 plus, you must define at least one user (i.e. enter at least one Multiple Subscriber Number [MSN]).

The detailed procedure for setting a user is described under »User setup«

If you wish to use the telephone first and define a user later:





Lift the handset and enter a number. The number is displayed.

Replace the handset when the call is over. Date and time are displayed.

Do not forget to define at least one user later, to ensure full functionality of your Eurit 33 (see »User setup«).

Positioning the telephone

Your telephone is designed for use under normal conditions. Modern furniture is coated with a wide range of varnishes and plastics and treated with a variety of different finishes and polishes. Some of these agents may contain ingredients that corrode and soften the plastic pads of the telephone. If this happens, it may lead to undesirable marks on the furniture surface.

Understandably, the manufacturer cannot accept any liability for such damage.

We therefore recommend that you position your telephone on a non-slip mat, especially if it is placed on new or varnished furniture.

Preparing the write-on labels.

Turn over the printed write-on label for speed-dial numbers or cut out a label from the back of the operating instructions. The label for your own telephone number is also located at the back of the operating instructions.

If you already know which speed-dial numbers you wish to store, note the associated numbers or functions on the write-on label for speed-dial numbers. Enter your own number(s) and emergency numbers on the write-on label for your telephone number.

Place the labels in the label recesses (left of the short dialling keys or on the underside of the handset) and cover them with the transparent panel.

Changing the housing

Your telephone is delivered with a standard mounted housing (upper housing cover). You can change the housing as required, in order to customise your telephone. Other housings in a range of colours are available from your telephone retail outlet as accessories for the Eurit 33 / 33 plus.

Unplug the telephone before changing housings! To change the housing, grip the upper left-hand corner (above the display) with the right hand. Place the left hand on the handset and press down against the base of the telephone. Now give the cover a good pull towards you (slight upward pull).


Position the new housing correctly and press it onto the telephone until it clicks into place. Check that all keys can be activated easily. Plug the telephone in again.

Emergency mode

If the 230 V power supply is cut off from the mains connector (NTBA), the ISDN port is powered directly from the exchange (emergency mode). This remote power supply is sufficient only to power a single telephone.

If several telephones are operated from the same connection, only one set may be authorised for emergency mode. Otherwise the entire ISDN port is disabled during emergency operation.

The emergency mode switch is located under the write-on label for one-touch numbers.



Activating emergency mode authorisation

Emergency mode authorisation can be activated by pressing the switch (e.g. with a ballpoint pen). The switch slides to the lower position.

Deactivating emergency mode authorisation

Slide the switch to off position by pressing against the retaining spring (e.g. with a ballpoint pen).

- □ In the event of a power failure the settings and entries in the phonebook are retained.
- During emergency mode the display may be switched off. Ringing and loudspeaker volume may also be reduced.
- The emergency mode telephone signals calls for all Multiple Subscriber Numbers (MSN).
- To telephone in emergency mode you must first lift the handset and then dial the number (loudspeaker key does not function).
- The emergency mode telephone should be clearly marked with a stick-on label.

User concept

The Eurit 33 / 33 plus allows you to set up to five users for one telephone. For example, if you use the telephone at home you can set the following users: »Mother«, »Father«, »Child 1«, »Child 2«, and »Child 3«. If, for instance, you use it for work and private applications, you can set »Company«, »Private«, »Club 1«, »Club 2«, and »Club 3«. You can switch from one user to another by pressing the user key. The display shows the active user's code (A, B, C, D or E).

The detailed procedure for setting different users is described in the Chapter »Basic settings«.

Once you have defined the relevant settings for each user, your Eurit 33 / 33 plus handles various functions individually depending on the set user. For every call the active user's number is displayed on the partner's telephone. Incoming calls are assigned to the relevant user and stored in his own caller list or TAM. Costs are charged to the individual users. Calls can be separately forwarded according to the user's individual requirements.

Changing users

If a user code (A, B, C, D or E) is displayed on the right of the upper display line, the user can be changed as follows:

The active user is displayed on the right of the upper display line.



Press the user key.
The name of the next user is briefly displayed.



Press the user key until the relevant user is displayed.



After a brief pause the previous display reappears, with the code of the selected user in the upper display line.

Basic operating information

Display in standby mode

If your Eurit 33 / 33 plus is in standby mode, the display shows the date, status pictograms (if applicable), the time and the active user code. If more than 8 status pictograms are displayed, the date is not shown.



If you press the Foxkey under >> you are given the choice of the functions »Suppress No.« or »Tell No.« and can activate them by pressing the Foxkey again. The associated status pictogram is displayed or disappears.

Menus

The Eurit 33 / 33 plus offers simple operation thanks to menu-driven guidance. Entries in the phonebook (and subsequent editing), settings and programming are performed using menus. If you have selected menus or submenus, the handset must always be on-hook. If you receive a call or lift the handset during menu selection, the procedure is automatically aborted.

Use the menu key and Foxkey to select menus or submenus as follows:



The entire menu structure is described under »Important information«.

Acoustic signals

Your telephone offers further operating assistance by means of acoustic signals:

Confirmation signal

This confirms correct entries/changes by emitting two short, high tones.

Warning signal

This alerts you to incorrect manoeuvres or entries by emitting a single deep warning signal.

On-hook dialling





Enter the number you wish to call.

You can press the Foxkey under ஹ→ to search for and dial a number stored in the phonebook (see »Dialling from the phonebook«)

Press the Foxkey under *00 to enter the dialled number in the phonebook.

Press the Foxkey under »del« to delete the character at the cursor position.





Press loudspeaker kev.






Lift the handset when your call has been answered.

Redial

The redial memory stores the 10 last-dialled telephone numbers irrespective of which user has entered the numbers (the redial memory is not user-specific). You can call these numbers again without entering the numbers.






Press the redial key, if necessary several times, to select a number from the last-dialled number list.


The display shows the last-dialled number or, if this is stored in the phonebook, the associated name.





You can scroll up or down the list using the Foxkey under \checkmark or \land .






Lift the handset or press the loudspeaker key. The number is dialled.

- If the redial memory is full, the oldest entry is overwritten.
- To delete an entry in the redial memory, press the Foxkey under »del«.
- To display detailed information on an entry in the redial memory, press the Foxkey under »i«. The display shows the active user, charge and duration of the call.
- Calling Line Identification Restriction (CLIR, suppress calling number) is recognised by the redial memory and indicated by a »C« in front of the number.

Dialling numbers from the caller list

Every unanswered call is entered in an individual caller list for each user. Up to 30 calls are stored in the caller list (in total for all users).

If someone has tried to reach you, a message - for example »\(\frac{1}{2}\)3(5)« - appears in the lower display line. The number in brackets indicates that 5 calls have been made to your Eurit 33 and the number preceding this indicates that 3 calls were intended for the active user.







Press the Foxkey under »₹3(5)« to call up your personal caller list.

The display shows the number of the most recent incoming call or, if this is stored in the phonebook, the caller's name.





If several calls have been made to your telephone, you can scroll up or down the list using the Foxkey under \checkmark or \land .



Lift the handset or press the loudspeaker key. The number is dialled.

- Press the Foxkey under »i« to display the date and time of the call (if a caller has called several times e.g. 3x, the date and time of the last call are displayed).
- After 30 calls the oldest entry is overwritten.
- Once you have returned the call from the caller list, the unanswered call is deleted and stored in the redial memory.
- Press the Foxkey under →□□ to enter the dialled number in the phonebook.
- To delete an entry from the caller list, press the Foxkey under »del« (the entry can only be deleted if no message has been left).
- ☐ If the caller has recorded a message, the lower display line also shows ☐ i. The message can be played back by pressing the Foxkey under ☐ i.
- ☐ If the caller has left a mail (UUS), the lower display also shows ☐. To show the mail, press
 the Foxkey under ☐.

Dialling from the call LOG


Your Eurit 33 / 33 plus stores the last 10 answered calls (total for all users) in the call LOG.

Press the LOG key, if necessary several times, to select a number from the list of answered calls. The display shows the number of the most recently answered call or, if this is stored in the phonebook, the caller's name.

If several calls have been made to your telephone, you can scroll up or down the list using the Foxkey under \checkmark or \land .

Lift the handset or press the loudspeaker key. The number is dialled

- Press the Foxkey under »i« to display the user along with date and time of the last answered calls.
- Press the Foxkey under →□□ to enter the dialled number in the phonebook.
- To delete an entry in the caller list, press the Foxkey under »del«.

Speed-dialling



Dial: 0551234567 00> +00 del >> Press the relevant speed-dialling key briefly (numbers 1 to 5) or twice in rapid succession (numbers 6 to 10).

The preprogrammed number or function is displayed.



Lift the handset or press the loudspeaker key.

The number is dialled or the function executed.

For detailed information on speed-dialling, refer to »Speed-dialling«.

Incoming calls

Incoming calls are signalled by the user's own set ringing melody, in order to acoustically distinguish between calls for different users.


The display shows the caller's number provided Calling Line Identification Presentation is active or the number is available. If the number is stored in the phonebook, the name is automatically displayed. The name on the left of the display shows which user is being calls.

Rejecting incoming calls



If you do not wish to answer an incoming call:





Press the Foxkey under >> until »reject« appears in the lower display line.



Press Foxkey under »reject«.
The call is rejected and the caller's number is stored in the caller list.

- The lower display line offers you further options:
 - →•TAM (Forward call to TAM)
 - forward (Forward call to another number, see »Advanced features«).

Handsfree

If you wish to conduct a call without using the handset, you can talk into the microphone of your Eurit 33 / 33 plus and listen to your call partner over the loudspeaker.



During the call press the loudspeaker key and hold down until you have replaced the handset.

You can hear your call partner in the handset as well as through the loudspeaker.



Replace the handset and release the loudspeaker key. Handsfree operation is activated.



If you wish to continue the call on the handset, lift the handset.

Setting the volume during a call

The volume is set to medium. During a call you can adjust the volume (1 to 7).



During a call press the plus key (up) or minus key (down) to change the volume in the handset and loudspeaker. The setting is saved.

The volume can be set individually for each user.

Listening by loudspeaker

Other people can listen to your call over the loudspeaker. The microphone is switched off.













During the call press the loudspeaker key. You can hear your call partner in the handset as well as through the loudspeaker.

Press the Foxkey under >> . The lower display line shows the new dialling options.

Press Foxkey under »Mic off«. The microphone is switched off. The symbol in the display changes from a to a.


Mute

If you do not wish your call partner to hear you (e.g. to speak to someone else in the room), you can switch the handset microphone off.









During the call press the Foxkey under >> . The lower display line shows the new dialling options.

Press Foxkey under »Mic off«.
The handset microphone is muted.
The symbol in the display changes from a to a.
To switch the handset microphone on again, press the Foxkey under »Mic on« (the symbol a reappears).

Phonebook.

To make calls quickly and simply, you can enter at least 100 names and numbers in a phonebook. The phonebook is accessible to all users.

General information

Letters are printed above the numbers on your keypad. To enter a letter, press the relevant key once or more until the letter appears. (For example, to enter »S«, press key 7 four times.

By pressing the Foxkey under »A *a « or »a *A « you can switch between upper and lower case. In addition to the alphabet, individual keys also provide special characters and accents.

- To correct errors, use the arrow key to position the cursor at the character to be changed. Delete the character by pressing the Foxkey under »del«. At the end of a line you can use the plus key to enter a space.


Phonebook

If long numbers/names are entered, ... is displayed as the first character when the line is wrapped. The start is shown again once entry is completed.

Press the Foxkey repeatedly under \vee or \wedge to scroll through the phonebook.

Entering attributes

Attributes contain additional information (specific character sequences) on a number in the phonebook. They are used by your Eurit 33 / 33 plus to control functions e.g. activate Calling Line Identification Restriction (CLIR). In most cases the attributes must be entered before the number, but in certain cases the attribute needs to be added after the number. Note the following rules:



Provider: Select attribute »Provider« (P) as the first character, enter provider number (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6), enter number.

Subaddress: Enter first part of the number, select attribute »Subadress« (Z), enter subaddress.

Exchange access code: Select attribute »EAC « (X) as the first character, enter number.

Keypad: Select attribute »Keypad« (K) as the first character, keypad number.

Calling Line Identification Restriction (CLIR) Select attribute »Suppress No.« (X) as the first character, enter number.

PBX Operation

The following applies when using in conjunction with a PBX:

- Always enter a number in the phonebook along with the prefix, in order to display the name.
- Do not enter the exchange access code (EAC) if this is automatically inserted (see »PBX Operation: setting the EAC«).
- To allow your Eurit 33 / 33 plus to identify numbers for which no prefix has been given (e.g. emergency numbers, provider code) as external numbers, you must select the attribute »EAC« (Exchange Access Code). An »X« is then displayed in front of the number.

Enter the associated number (if you first need to enter an attribute e.g. provider or keypad, proceed as follows).

If you need to enter an attribute (provider, subaddress, EAC, keypad or CLIR) with the number, press the Foxkey under »Attribute« at the appropriate place.

The attributes are shown in the lower display line. Attribute entry can be aborted by pressing »back«.

Press the Foxkey to show the relevant attribute under >> if this is not already displayed.

Press the Foxkey under the appropriate attribute symbol.

The attribute is inserted

- »P« for Provider
- »Z« for Subadress
- »X« for Exchange Access Code (EAC)
- »K« for Keypad
- »C« for CLIR





Deleting an entry

Entries in the phonebook are deleted by pressing the Foxkey under »del«.

Individual user charges, call charge total

You can display and delete the taxes (charges) incurred by each user individually. You can also call up the charge total for all calls made from the telephone.


Malicious Call Identification (MCID)

This service must be requested from your network provider. This function allows the number of the caller and the called party to be registered by the exchange along with date and time.

Malicious calls can be registered during the call and up to 20 seconds after the caller has hung up.

Malicious calls can only be registered with the handset off-hook (i.e. not in handsfree or listening by loudspeaker mode).

To activate MCID:



DTMF (Dual Tone Multifrequency)

Once a connection is established, the Eurit 33/33 plus automatically switches to DTMF/MFV. This allows you for example to play back TAM messages remotely.

Subaddresses



Introduction

Your **Eurit 33 plus** comes with an integrated telephone answering device (TAM). Greetings (outgoing announcements) and incoming messages are digitally stored i.e. the TAM requires no magnetic recording tape and hence no maintenance. All messages can be played back quickly and simply. The entire recording time for greetings and incoming messages depends on the set recording quality (see »Recording quality/recording time«). The maximum recording time is approximately 22 minutes.

The TAM can be set for individual users:

Every user can

- activate and deactivate the TAM individually.
- select either »Answer and record« or »Answer only« mode.
- set one of five personal greetings or the default greeting.

- Remote access of the TAM is terminated when you replace the handset.
- Pauses between entering digits must be no longer than 9 seconds, otherwise the remote access procedure is aborted.
- To resume to basic remote access status or abort a function, press key 2.
- The remote access PIN code must be entered while the greeting is being played.
- Attention: »Call forwarding permanent« must be deactivated, otherwise your remote access call will be directly forwarded to the defined number (see »Call forwarding«).

Setting the PIN-Code

The PIN code for remote access is valid for all users.

When operating the Eurit 33 / 33 plus in conjunction with a PBX there are special aspects to take into account. For further information, refer to your PBX operating instructions.

Setting the Exchange Access Code (EAC)

When operating your telephone in conjunction with a PBX without automatic external line selection, the EAC may need to be set as follows:



- If you have set an EAC, you must always enter numbers in the phonebook with the prefix but without EAC (as with numbers for speed-dialling). For emergency or service numbers, enter »X« before the number (forced insertion of EAC). See also »Phonebook«.
- If you have set an EAC, internal and external calls are automatically distinguished. The ringing tone for an external call is signalled by a short interruption of the normal ringing tone.
- ♥ When dialling from the keypad the EAC is not automatically selected.

Incoming EAC

Some PBXs automatically insert the EAC for incoming calls. In this case »Incoming EAC « must be activated so that, for example, numbers from the caller list can be correctly selected.



You need to give the software version and checksum when you contact the service hotline with a problem.

PC dialling option (PC Dialer II)

The Ascom PC Dialer is an add-on for the Eurit 33 / 33 plus that enables Computer Telephone Integration (CTI).

The software delivered with the PC Dialer II contains a TAPI driver and a program for configuring the Eurit 33 / 33 plus and downloading phonebook entries from the PC to the Eurit 33 / 33 plus. Calls are then automatically shown on the screen and stored in the PC.

The TAPI driver allows you to connect certain database programs directly to your Eurit 33 / 33 plus.

Software update

You can use the Ascom PC Dialer II to upgrade the Eurit 33 / 33 plus software. The firmware required for this procedure is downloadable from the Ascom home page (see back page).




